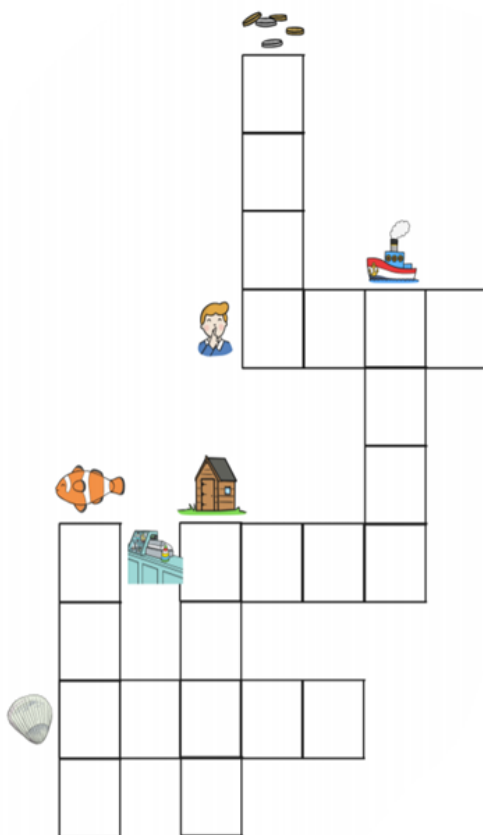
## LASTEST NEWS - What's going on in the world?

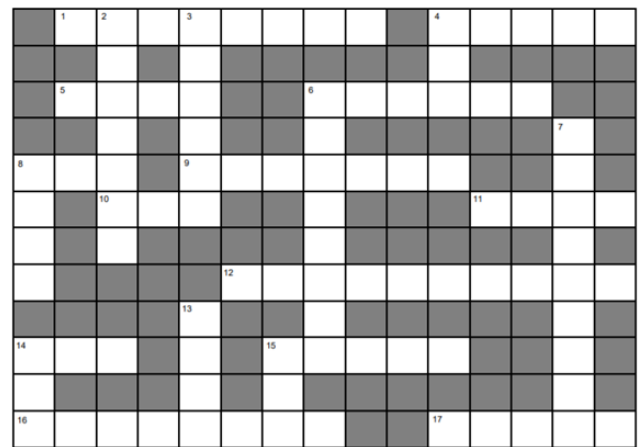
